Technology Innovation and Incubation Centre is a registered society (Reg. No. 02/42/01/13439/10 dated March 05, 2010) under MP Society Registration Act 1973). TIIC got the Technology Incubation and Development of Entrepreneurs (TIDE) 1.0 scheme from MeitY, New Delhi in the year of 2010-11 with the financial support of 1.55 Crore and incubated 20+ startups.

TIIC has also got the TIDE2.0 Scheme from MeitY, New Delhi from 2018-19 with the financial support of Rs.1.70 Crore. TIIC has supported 8 startups till now and three startups in pipeline for funding support. Now the MeitY, New Delhi has asked to convert this Registered Society to Section 08/25 company.

The BoG has approved the change of status of TIIC from registered society to Section 8/25 company status and suggested to hire a company secretary/CA to guide the institute on such matters.

The 27th Senate meeting was held on 01.12.2022 were deemed as confirmed since no comments were received. Some of the salient points of senate approvals are:

• The Senate approved the proposal of the Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering to start the new B. Tech. (4-years) program titled "Electrical and Electronics Engineering" with 40 students. However, owing to the problem of hostel accommodation, it would cut the intake of IMT and IMG students by 30 and 10, respectively.

- The Senate approved the proposal of the Department of Applied Sciences to start the new B.S. (4-years) program titled "Mathematics and Scientific Computing" with 20 students. Chairman Senate is authorized to see the other logistic before starting the program.

- The Senate approved renaming the existing M. Tech. course titled "Computer Networks" to "Wireless Networks and Computing".
- The Senate approved the one of the criteria for eligibility criteria for admission to Master of Business Administration (MBA) program and Doctoral (PhD) program in Management as follows.

### 1. For MBA:

- A First-Class Bachelor's Degree with minimum of 60% marks or 6.50 CGPA on a 10-point scale or equivalent in aggregate (of all the years/semesters) in any discipline awarded by any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or declared deemed-to-be-University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, or equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.
- The Bachelor's degree obtained by the candidate must have (a)
   Mathematics/Statistics as one of the courses, and (b) a minimum of three years of
   education after completing higher secondary schooling (10+2) or equivalent.
- o A valid CAT score.
- 2. For PhD: M. Sc. / MBA /M. A. / MBBS or equivalent with 60% marks or 6.75 GPA on a 10-point scale with Mathematics/Statistics as one of the courses at UG level.
- The Senate in principle approved the proposal to exit with only a B. Tech. Degree if credit requirements and relevant courses are completed for a B. Tech. degree. To insure this, chairman senate may form a committee to see it on the case-to-case basis.

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

ATAL BIHARI BAJPAYEE-INDIAN INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TEHNOLOGY AND MANAGEMENT (ABV-IIITM), GWALIORG, INDIA

AND

THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING, THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF ENGINNERING AND SCIENCE, UNIVERSITY OF THE RYUKYUS, OKINAWA, JAPAN

Atal Bihari Bajpayee-Indian Institute of Information Technology (ABV-IIITM), Gwalior, India and the Faculty of Engineering, the Graduate School of Engineering and Science, the University of the Ryukyus, Okinawa, Japan (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Parties" or individually referred to as "Party"), enter into this memorandum of understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU"), based on a foundation of mutual trust established by previous exchange programs, to promote further exchange of students, faculty, and staff in order to advance scientific research, education, and cultural understanding, and to contribute to the mutual benefit and development of the Parties.

- 1. The Parties shall promote the following exchange activities based on their respective academic and educational needs:
  - (1) Exchange of students
  - (2) Exchange of faculty and staff members
  - (3) Exchange of academic materials, publications, and information
  - (4) Joint hosting of seminars, conferences, and symposia
  - (5) Joint research
  - (6) Other academic exchanges
- 2. Nothing shall diminish the full autonomy of either Party, nor will each Party impose any constraints upon the other regarding enforcement of the MOU.
- 3. All activities developed under the auspices of this MOU will respect and conform to the corresponding international laws, norms, traditions and regulations of each institution, its country and region.
- 4. The implementation of each exchange based on this MOU shall be separately negotiated and determined by the Parties. Exchange activities shall be carried out within the scope of each Party's financial, material, and institutional limitations. With this understanding and the mutual agreement of the Parties, any agreement based on this MOU may be executed.
- 5. The Parties shall respect each other's rights concerning confidentiality and intellectual property. Intellectual property rights resulting from exchange activities shall be separately discussed and agreed upon between the Parties.
- 6. If any dispute arises between the Parties, they shall respond in good faith and endeavor to reach an amicable settlement. Disputes that cannot be amicably resolved shall be subject to legal measures including, but not limited to, arbitration and lawsuit.
- 7. This MOU is subject to revision by mutual consent. It is also understood that each Party may terminate the MOU at any time, although such action shall only be taken after mutual consideration in order to avoid any possible inconvenience to each Party.

8. This MOU shall be effective when the representatives of the Parties have signed the MOU and is valid for a term of five years. It may be automatically renewed for any successive period of five years unless terminated by each party by giving written notice at least three months in advance to the other party.

### STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

ATAL BIHARI BAJPAYEE-INDIAN INSRITUTION OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND
MANAGEMENT (ABV-IIITM), GWALIOR, INDIA
AND

THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING, THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING AND SCIENCE, UNIVERSITY OF THE RYUKYUS, OKINAWA, JAPAN

Atal Bihari Bajpayee-Indian Institute of Information Technology (ABV-IIITM), Gwalior, India and the Faculty of Engineering, the Graduate School of Engineering and Science, the University of the Ryukyus, Okinawa, Japan shall exchange undergraduate and graduate students for the purpose of education and research under this agreement based on the Memorandum of Understanding between Atal Bihari Bajpayee-Indian Institute of Information Technology (ABV-IIITM), Gwalior, India and the Faculty of Engineering, the University of the Ryukyus signed on [08-12-2022].

### 1. Number of Exchange Students

Each party send and accept under this agreement not more than three students each academic year.

### 2. Duration of Stav

Duration of stay for exchange students at the host institution shall be in principle up to one academic year.

### 3. Selection of Exchange Students and Acceptance Procedures

The home institution shall initially select students to participate in the exchange program under the terms of this agreement, but the host institution shall make final admission decisions in each case.

### 4. Study Program

The host institution determines a study program suitable for each student with the student's academic background and preferences taken into consideration.

### 5. Status of Exchange Students

Each party shall accept exchange students as non-degree-seeking students at the host institution.

### 6. Academic Record and Accreditation

The host institution shall evaluate the academic performance of each student pursuant to its rules and shall send the academic record or transcript of each exchange student to the home institution. The home institution may give credit to each student in accordance with its requirements.

### 7. Waiver of Tuition and Fees

Each host institution shall provide waiver of entrance examination fees, admission fees, and tuition for the exchange students.

### 8. Financial Responsibility

Exchange students shall take out comprehensive health insurance that is valid at the host institution, and shall be responsible for such expenses as travel, accommodations, living costs and health care.

### 9. Accommodations

The host institution shall do its best to secure appropriate accommodations for exchange students.

### 10. Personal Information

Both parties agree that they will ensure that all student records and personal information are held securely and confidentially and undertake to further ensure that the aforementioned data is not used or disclosed for any purpose other than the administration of the student exchange program. Both parties acknowledge that personal information relating to participating students supplied by their home institution is to be processed by the host institution only in accordance with the terms of this agreement and otherwise of the express instructions of the home institution, as well as the legislation of both countries on the subject, and agree that they will take appropriate technical and organizational measures against unlawful or unauthorized processing and accidental loss, destruction or damage of such personal information.

- 11. This agreement shall not ensure the availability of scholarships for exchange students, but each institution shall endeavor to provide useful information on scholarship programs that will financially assist the students.
- 12. This agreement is subject to revision or termination by mutual consent, although such action shall only be taken after mutual consultation in order to avoid any possible inconvenience to the other institution.
- 13. This agreement shall become effective when the representatives of both parties have affixed their signatures hereunder and shall be effective for five years. It may be automatically renewed for any successive period of five years unless terminated by either party by giving written notice at least three months in advance to the other party.
